DHS CISA guidance defines such services within the transportation and logistics sector to include "[e]mployees who repair and maintain vehicles" and would therefore include dealers' service and parts departments. Connecticut	Repair Only (Service/Parts)	<p>Governor Lamont issued Executive Order No. 7H which orders a 100% workforce reduction between March 23, 2020 at 8:00 p.m. through April 22, 2020. Not later than 8 p.m. on March 22, 2020, the Department of Economic and Community Development ("DECD") shall issue lawfully binding guidance about which businesses are essential. Those business shall include, but not be limited to, the 16 critical infrastructure sectors as defined by the Department of Homeland Security. The executive order does not reference auto dealers or repair functions but the DHS guidance includes in the "Transportation and Logistics" sector all "automotive repair and maintenance facilities". The Connecticut Automotive Retailers Association (CARA) has indicated that service and repair departments are essential and showroom/sales department may NOT be open to the public for sales. However, remote sales are being allowed during this period. Dealers can have the essential sales and support staff at the store to handle these remote business procedures (e.g. - DMV/title clerks and F&I and office staff for documentation and registration processes). Delaware	Repair Only (Service/Parts)	<p>Governor John Carney issued the fourth modification to his State of Emergency declaration, closing all non-essential businesses in Delaware to help fight the spread of COVID-19. The orders go into effect at 8:00 a.m. on Tuesday, March 24, 2020. They will remain in effect until May 15 or until the public health threat is eliminated. Essential businesses that are entitled to continue operation are defined to include "[a]utomotive repair and maintenance facilities" (section 6.f.7.) and "[a]utomobile and bicycle repair facilities or those engaged in the sale or distribution of equipment or parts necessary for the repair of automobiles and bicycles" (section 6.g.4.). Employees who repair and maintain vehicles are deemed essential (section 6.f.9.). Illinois	Open Even Under Shelter-In-Place	<p>Governor Pritzker issued Executive Order No. 20-10 (a/k/a COVID-19 Executive Order No. 8) that effective March 21, 2020 at 5pm through the duration of the disaster, which currently extends through April 7, 2020, allows only those essential businesses to stay open. "Essential businesses" is broadly defined to include at Section 12(e) of the executive order any "Gas stations and auto-supply, auto-repair, and related facilities and bicycle shops and related facilities" (emphasis added). Also included are (1) businesses that sell, manufacture, or supply other Essential Businesses and Operations with the support or materials necessary to operate; and (2) commercial transportation and logistics providers (Sections 12(n), (o)). All businesses except for essential businesses and operations are required to cease as of the effective date. Essential businesses and operations are defined in Section 14.a. to incorporate by reference the Department of Homeland Security's Cybersecurity and Infrastructure Security Agency (CISA) guidance, which includes "[e]mployees who repair and maintain vehicles" and would therefore include dealers' service and parts departments. Section 6(m) of the order includes in the category of "essential businesses" any "[c]ar dealerships, <u>but only to provide auto maintenance and repair services, and auto mechanics</u>" (emphasis added). The order mandates closure of physical retail locations, but the New Jersey Coalition of Automotive Retailers (NJCAR) has advised that it does leave open the potential for online sales.
